NOTES

• Wofford wrapped up at least a share of its fifth Southern Conference title and first since 2012 with its 45-14 win at VMI on Saturday. The Terriers finished their league slate at 7-1, a mark Furman could match with a win at Samford on Saturday, but Wofford secured the SoCon's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs by virtue of its 24-23 win over the Paladins to open the season on Sept. 2.

• If Furman downs Samford on Saturday, the Paladins would claim a share of their league-best 14th SoCon title and first since 2013. Both teams come into the contest with 7-3 overall records, nationally ranked and trying to bolster FCS Playoff résumés.

• ETSU visits Chattanooga in the only other league game on the slate for the final weekend of the regular season. The Citadel, Mercer, Western Carolina and Wofford are all in action at FBS Power 5 opponents.

• The SoCon is the only conference in college football that will take on both the reigning FCS and FBS national champions this season. In addition to ETSU squaring off against FCS top-ranked JMU on Sept. 9, The Citadel will face Clemson on Saturday.

• Furman, which is in the STATS FCS Top 25 for the third straight week, moving up one spot to No. 20, debuted in the FCS Coaches Poll for the first time this season at No. 24. The Paladins are in the coaches' rankings for the first time since the Sept. 15, 2014, poll.

• Wofford moved up one spot to seventh in both polls, while Samford climbed one spot to 13th in the coaches' rankings but dropped one spot to 17th in the STATS poll despite a 42-7 win over ETSU on Saturday.

• Western Carolina fell 35-33 to Mercer on Saturday, dropping the Catamounts from the national rankings and dealing their FCS Playoff hopes a hit. WCU has one more chance to impress the NCAA Division I Football Championship Committee when it heads to Chapel Hill, North Carolina, Saturday for a date against the North Carolina Tar Heels.

• Mercer will take on its second SEC opponent this season when it faces No. 1 Alabama on Saturday. The Bears faced then-No. 15 Auburn on Sept. 16.

• Samford quarterback Devlin Hodges threw for four touchdowns in a 42-7 win over ETSU on Saturday, pushing his career total to 76 and moving him past two-time Walter Payton Award winner and SoCon Hall of Famer Armanti Edwards of Appalachian State into second on the SoCon's career list.

• Western Carolina running back Detrez Newsome needs just seven rushing yards to become the first-ever Catamount with three 1,000-yard seasons. With 118 all-purpose yards at Mercer on Saturday, Newsome moved into second place in SoCon history with 6,814, passing SoCon Hall of Famer and 1999 Walter Payton Award winner Adrian Peterson of Georgia Southern (6,784) and second only to VMI's Thomas Haskins, who had 7,355 from 1993-96.

SoCON PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Tyrie Adams, R-So., QB
Western Carolina

Adams accounted for 433 yards of total offense and threw for three touchdowns in the Catamounts' 35-33 loss at Mercer. The redshirt sophomore went 35-for-47 for a season-best 378 yards through the air, good for a completion percentage of 74.5 percent, and ran for 55 yards on 15 carries. His 433 yards of total offense tied for fifth in a game in school history, while his passing yardage pushed his season total to 2,225, 10th-most in a season in WCU history. Adams, who tossed three TD passes for the second straight game, moved his season total to 21 touchdown passes, matching the Catamount school record for a single season.

DEFENSIVE

Lee Bennett, Sr., LB
Mercer

Bennett recorded 16 tackles, recovered a fumble and intercepted a pass Saturday to help the Bears to a 35-33 win over No. 25 Western Carolina. The senior counted 1.5 tackles for loss for 6 yards among his stops against the Catamounts. With WCU leading 7-0 in the first quarter, Bennett recorded his first interception of the season deep in Western Carolina territory to set up a three-play, 13-yard scoring drive that pulled Mercer even. In the third quarter, with the Bears nursing a 28-23 lead and the Catamounts inside the red zone and threatening to pull ahead, Bennett recovered a fumble at the Mercer 15-yard line to stop the drive.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Chandler Curtis, Sr., WR/RS
Mercer

Curtis accounted for a game-high 184 all-purpose yards in Saturday's win over No. 25 Western Carolina, racking up 128 yards on kick returns and 46 on punt returns in addition to 10 receiving yards. The senior from Calhoun, Georgia, returned a first-quarter punt 39 yards to the Western Carolina 36-yard line, setting up the Bears' second score of the day. Midway through the fourth quarter, Curtis returned a kickoff 77 yards to the WCU 17, setting up what would prove to be the decisive touchdown in the Bears' two-point win. The 77-yard kick return was the third-longest in program history.
