Chattanooga Outlook

All-SoCon running back Eldra Buckley has departed for the NFL leaving a hole in the backfield. The Mocs return talented quarterback Antonio Miller but last year's top four receivers are gone. Four starters return along the offensive line. On defense, 13 of the top 16 tacklers from last year are back led by senior outside linebacker Chris Johnson (74 total tackles) and senior defensive back Chris Camacho (56 total tackles). Chattanooga has won its last two season-openers including a 31-7 triumph at Tennessee Tech in 2006.

Jacobs Blocking Trophy winner senior left guard Kerry Brown anchors a strong offensive line. The defense is led by All-American Corey Lynch (5 interceptions) and junior linebacker Pierre Banks (110 total tackles). All-SoCon senior place-kicker Julian Rauch returns. Appalachian State brings a 14-game winning streak into the season-opener.
