ETSU's Clayton named Player of the Year, Devine named Coach of the Year

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – ETSU's Leah Clayton was named the Southern Conference Player of the Year for the 2018 season. In addition, ETSU's Lindsey Devine was named coach of the year and ETSU sophomore Marija Popovic repeated as libero of the year. Samford's Lauren Deaton earned the Rayna Taylor Award, given annually to the league's freshman of the year. The league coaches voted on a pair of all-conference teams, an all-freshman team, libero of the year, and coach of the year. They were not allowed to vote for themselves or their own players.

Clayton claims the award after leading the Bucs to a 15-1 mark in conference play en route to the regular-season title. The Danville, Virginia, native led ETSU with 438 kills, nearly four kills a set, and was second on the team behind only Popovic with 298 digs. She added 46 blocks, 25 service aces and 22 assists in her impressive junior campaign. She also tallied 13 double-doubles, including four in a row in conference play from Oct. 26 to Nov. 2. A 2017 first-team all-conference selection, Clayton was the SoCon offensive player of the week three times this season. Clayton's 438 kills are second-most in the conference, though her 3.91 kills per set are a league best. The outside hitter is ETSU's seventh player of the year, tying Furman for the most in conference history, and the Bucs' first since Briana Allmon was honored in 2016.

ETSU led the conference with nine postseason awards including Devine's coach of the year nod. In her 16th season, Devine guided the Bucs to their conference-leading sixth regular-season title, losing only one conference match and ending the year on a 10-match win streak and 14-match win streak in conference play. ETSU amassed 16 sweeps, 10 of which came against conference opponents. Two Bucs – Popovic and Alyssa Kvarda, the Bucs' setter – joined Clayton on the all-conference first team, which included eight players due to a tie in the voting. Kvarda paced the Bucs' offense, finishing the regular season second among conference players with 1,210 assists. She was the September offensive player of the month. Popovic, the 2017-18 freshman of the year and libero of the year, totaled a league-best 587 digs and was named the September and October defensive player of the month. The Belgrade, Serbia, native tallied double-digit digs in all but two matches and had 20-plus digs in 14 contests.

Samford added two to the first team, placing seniors Taylor Anderton and Krista Boesing on the squad. The Bulldogs, the lone team to beat ETSU, finished conference play 11-5, good enough for second. Anderton, a setter, leads the country in total assists with 1,332 this season. Boesing leads the conference with 447 total kills on the year. Furman's Carris Campbell, Wofford's Catie Cronister and Mercer's Paige Alsten rounded out the first team. Campbell, a middle blocker, led the Paladins with 266 kills and 84 blocks and hit a team-high .303 in her senior campaign. Cronister, the 2017 co-player of the year, led the Terriers with 377 kills and was second on the team with 273 digs. The junior from Chicago, Illinois, compiled a league-high 48 service assists. Alsten, a senior middle blocker, hit a league-best .344 on the year.

The second team also featured eight players due to a tie in the voting, led by two selections from ETSU and two from Furman. The Bucs placed Mariah McPartland and Braedyn Tutton, both senior middle blockers, on the squad, while Furman placed libero Meg DeMaar and setter Hunter Thompson, both redshirt seniors, on the team. McPartland led the league with 125 blocks, while Tutton's .337 hitting percentage was second among conference players. The SoCon active career leader in digs, DeMaar led Furman with 521 on the year, while Thompson led the Paladins with 1107 assists. Deaton, the freshman of the year, was named to the second team, along with The Citadel's Sharlissa De Jesus, Chattanooga's Dani Szczepanski and Wofford's Colleen Reilly.

Along with Deaton, the all-freshman team includes Furman's Neci Harris, Mercer's Annie Karle and Brittany Major, Chattanooga's Gylain Finch and Jaquelyn Langhaim and Western Carolina's Merry Gebel.

The Southern Conference Volleyball Championship will begin Friday, Nov. 16, on the campus of UNC Greensboro in Greensboro, North Carolina. Action kicks off at 9:30 a.m. with a showdown between eighth-seeded Western Carolina and ninth-seeded The Citadel. ETSU is the top seed in the tournament and will face the winner of that match in the quarterfinal round at 2:30 p.m. on Friday. The championship match is slated for Sunday at 2 p.m.

Notes

- The Southern Conference landed two teams in the NCAA tournament for the first time since the league began sponsoring volleyball in 1993.
- COACHING MILESTONES:** **Samford** head coach Keylor Chan earned his 300th career win and 50th at Samford. the NCAA First Round matchup will be his 100th as the leader of the Bulldogs. Lindsey Devine coached her 500th at **ETSU** and set a new single-season wins mark (27).
- PLAYER MILESTONES/NCAA STATS:** **Samford's** Taylor Anderton leads the country in total assists (1,476). She has 3,782 career assists, second among active players in the league. Krista Boesing (**Samford**) has 1,458 total attacks this season (6th) and is 20th in total kills (484). **ETSU's** Marija Popovic is 15th in total digs (641) and Leah Clayton is 16th in total kills (492).
- TEAM MILESTONES/NCAA STATS:** **Samford** is 3rd in total team attacks (4,983), 6th in team kills (1,762), 7th in team digs (2,195) and 7th in team assists (1,654). **ETSU**, meanwhile, is 13th in team kills (1,678), 18th in opponent hitting percentage (0.159) and 18th in team assists (1,558).
- Samford** in the NCAA Tourney: The Bulldogs are making their fourth overall appearance (0-3) in the NCAA tournament (all since 2011) and third in the last five years. Two of the three matches have been five-set losses, while one was a sweep. In 2011, Samford fell to Cincinnati (2-3) and in 2014, the Bulldogs lost to Alabama (2-3). In 2016, Chan's first year, the Bulldogs got swept by Kansas. It will be Chan's sixth time taking a team to the NCAA tournament. He led Northwestern to the tournament four times (2002, 2003, 2005 and 2010) and advanced to the second round twice (2005 and 2010).
- ETSU** in the NCAA Tourney: ETSU is making its second straight appearance in the tournament and third overall after earning the automatic bid in 2017. Devine and the Bucs went to the NCAA tournament in 2012 as the ASUN champion.
- CoSIDA Academic All-District: Krista Boesing (Samford) was one of four SoCon players named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District 4 team.
- SENIOR CLASS AWARD:** **ETSU's** AJ Lux and **Wofford's** Colleen Reilly were two of 30 NCAA DI volleyball seniors named candidates for the 2019 Senior CLASS Award. Candidates must have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character, and competition. When the list was whittled to 10 on Oct. 25, Lux and Reilly were not selected.
- NON-CONFERENCE:** SoCon teams went 54-55 in non-conference action and 6-18 against Power 5 schools, capped off by **ETSU's** win over No. 22 Washington State in their non-conference finale. The win was the first over a ranked team for Bucs' head coach Lindsey Devine (16 years). **Samford** narrowly missed its first-ever win over a ranked opponent when the Bulldogs fell in a five-set thriller at 25th-ranked Alabama. **Samford** swept Virginia Tech 3-0, **UNCG** downed Wake Forest, and **ETSU** beat Clemson and Duke to move the SoCon to 4-5 against ACC schools this year. SoCon schools are 5-5 against the ACC the last two seasons.

2018 SOCON CHAMPIONSHIP

No. 2 Samford wins 2018 SoCon Championship

GREENSBORO, N.C. - The second-seeded Samford Bulldogs won the 2018 Southern Conference Volleyball Championship, its second in three years under head coach Keylor Chan, beating top-seed and regular-season champion ETSU 3-1 (28-26, 20-25, 25-21, 26-24) and earning an automatic bid to the 2018 NCAA Division I Volleyball Championship on Sunday afternoon inside Fleming Gymnasium. The championship is Samford's fourth in program history, all coming in the last eight seasons.

The two teams split the regular-season matchups as both teams won in five on their home courts after trailing 2-0. Samford's victory over ETSU on Sept. 28 was the Bucs' only loss of the regular-season conference slate (14-1). Samford advanced to the championship with a 3-1 quarterfinal win over Chattanooga and a sweep of third-seeded Furman in the semifinals.

Samford (19-14) scored first on a kill from junior Kelsi Hobbs to open the match. The Bulldogs pulled ahead and took an 11-7 on a kill by Sierra Rayzor, but ETSU stormed back and won seven of the next eight points to take the lead 14-12 and force Chan to call a timeout. Hobbs answered with a kill out of the timeout, her fourth of the set, and pulled Samford within one. The teams traded points until Samford took a 19-17 lead and ETSU called timeout to regroup. Samford tacked on another out of the timeout and went up three on a service ace by Courtney Johnson.

The Bulldogs held on to the three-point lead and with the Bulldogs up 23-20, ETSU head coach Lindsey Devine used her second timeout of the set. The Bucs scored the first two out the timeout on a kill by Mariah McPartland and an attack error by Hobbs and pulled within one. Lauren Deaton, the 2018 SoCon Freshman of the Year, gave Samford set point, 24-22, but SoCon Player of the Year Leah Clayton answered for the Bucs. On Samford's second set point, an attack error by Hobbs tied it at 24 and Samford took its second timeout. The teams traded points, with ties again at 25 and 26, before an attack error by Clayton and a kill by Bulldog middle blocker Shayla gave Samford a 28-26 win. In total, the set featured 11 ties and six lead changes.

Samford took a 2-0 lead to begin the second set, but ETSU scored the next three to take a 3-2 lead, one the Bucs wouldn't relinquish the rest of the set. Samford pulled within two at 20-18, but ETSU scored the next point on a kill by Clayton and finished off the set 25-20.

In the third set, it was ETSU who took a 2-0 lead to open. The teams swapped points until Samford got back-to-back kills from Krista Boesing, a member of the all-conference first team, and took a 14-11 advantage. ETSU fought back to tie the set at 17 and again at 18, but Samford scored the next two and Devine called her second timeout trailing 20-18. The deficit was too much for ETSU to overcome as Samford scored five of the final eight to win 25-21 and take a 2-1 lead.

ETSU again took a 2-0 lead to start the fourth set, but Samford took a 7-5 lead and Devine used an early timeout. Out of the break, Samford pushed the lead to 12-7 and Devine used her second and final timeout of the set. It worked, as the Bucs scored three straight to cut the lead to 10-12 and forced Chan to use his first timeout. From there, the match was intense and evenly matched. The teams traded points until ETSU took an 18-15 lead and Chan used his second timeout to regroup his squad. ETSU held the lead and pushed it to 20-17, but kills by Hobbs, Alana Scouten and Deaton tied it at 20. Samford and ETSU were tied at 21, 22, and 23 before a kill by Deaton gave Samford match point. AJ Lux had a kill for the Bucs and the teams were again tied, this time at 24. An attack error by Lux on the next play, followed by a kill for Boesing, gave Samford the 26-24 set win and the 3-1 win.

Four Bulldogs finished in double-digit kills, led by Deaton and Boesing with 17. Deaton, a freshman outside hitter, added 16 digs, the second-most on the team, to earn a double-double. Boesing finished with five of Samford's nine blocks. Boesing was named to the all-tournament team, along with setter Taylor Anderton, who was named the Most Outstanding Player, and middle blocker Shayla Philip. Anderton, a senior, earned a double-double as she dished out 51 assists and had 12 digs, while Philip hit .381 with 11 kills. Hobbs also recorded a double-double with 11 kills and 12 digs.

Clayton led the Bucs with 24 kills, one short of her season high. She added 15 digs and hit .333 in the loss. Lux was right behind with 20 kills, while senior setter Alyssa Kvarta had 46 assists and 16 digs to pick up a double-double. Marija Popovic, the 2018 Libero of the Year, had 21 digs.

Samford will learn its NCAA tournament opponent at the selection show on Sunday, Nov. 25. The show is set for 8:30 p.m. ET on ESPNU.
